

The Bulkley-Morice Forest Landscape
Planning process included a public
engagement period from January 15 to
March 31, 2025. This was comprised of
three open houses held in the communities
of Granisle, Houston, and Smithers, to
inform the public and gather input on key
values to be considered in the plan.



As part of this process, the public was invited to complete a survey intended to assess whether all relevant values were being considered and to gain insight into how the public prioritized those values.

287 Survey Responses

Public feedback plays a critical role in shaping Forest Landscape
Plan by ensuring that planning decisions reflect a broad range of
perspectives, experiences, and values. Community members often
possess intimate knowledge of the local environment, including
cultural, historical, and ecological insights that may not be
captured by technical data alone. Public input ensures
these local values—such as recreation, biodiversity,
and cultural significance—are properly recognized
and integrated into the plan.

The survey included a section inviting respondents to comment on the values they wished to see reflected in the Forest Landscape Plan. Reoccurring themes were identified.

- watershed and ecosystem health
- local economy and job creation
- biodiversity protection
- sustainable forest management
- cultural and mental health benefits
- collaborative governance
- support for local communities

- cultural and spiritual significance
- ecotourism and economic alternatives
- opposition to logging
- scientific and ecological importance
- cumulative effects and landscape connectivity
- long term planning and community involvement

The insights and perspectives shared by community members through this engagement process will play a vital role in shaping the development of the project. This feedback will inform decision-making, guide planning efforts, and help ensure that the project supports sustainable outcomes that reflect the values and priorities identified by the community.
